Welcome to Term 3,

It seems as though this year is becoming more and more surreal. The border closed between NSW and Vic is unprecedented in our history and undoubtedly causing much frustration to many in our community. Despite the unsettling effect that these events would inevitably have on the broader community, our students here have taken the COVID-19 events in their stride. We have had a very settled first week, and the students all seem very happy to be back into their school routine.

Tell Them from Me: Over the holidays, we received a report compiled from the Tell Them From Me Survey conducted last term. Below are some of the findings:

- There was an improved participation rate from students this year with a 50% increase in students completing the survey from the previous 5 years, thanks to the efforts of Josephine Crowley in coordinating the TTFM
- Whilst students' self-perception of their progress in English, Mathematics and Science was slightly down on last year, the survey detected that the drivers for positive learning outcomes were improved. Things such as: effective learning time in class, relevance of student learning activities, rigour, advocacy of at school of students, teacher/student interactions, positive learning environment, expectations of success and post school
- Students' sense of school pride is elevated, particularly amongst our Aboriginal students.
- Our students' attitudes were at or above state average for most measure taken in terms of their positive attitude towards school.
- 79% of students felt that school was challenging. 36% of students felt that they were well equipped for the academic challenges. This is an area that we will be focussing on over the next twelve months. It is important that students feel that they have the skills to tackle the work that is asked of them.
- Overall, I am very pleased with these results. The students appear to be more satisfied and happy at school and these elements are vital to success.

Literacy: This term we are refocussing our efforts on student literacy. The new learning centre is closing in on assessing students that have been identified as experiencing difficulty with reading. Students will be withdrawn from class to attend individualised intensive reading support.

The reading program that was started last term has

been modified to focus more on writing skills.

Students that require intensive reading intervention will be picked by the staff in the Learning Centre.

# COVID-19 affects different people in different ways. Most infected people will develop mild to moderate illness and recover without hospitalization.

Most Common Symptoms:

- Fever
- Dry cough
- Tiredness

Less Common Symptoms:

- Aches and pains
- Sore throat
- Diarrhoea
- Conjunctivitis
- Headache
- Loss of smell
- Rash on skin or discolouration of fingers and toes

Serious Symptoms:

- Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
- Chest pain or pressure
- Loss of speech or movement

Seek immediate medical attention if you have serious symptoms. Always call before visiting your doctor or health facility.

People with mild symptoms who are otherwise healthy should manage their symptoms at home.

On average it takes 5-6 days from when someone is infected with the virus for symptoms to show, however it can take up to 14 days.

Please keep safe everyone and do not go to work or send your child to school if you or they are experiencing these symptoms.
