Danika Garner competed in the SA swimming state championships on the weekend. She was able to achieve some PB's as well as making the finals in some races.





Mrs HELEN DALTON (Murray)—Madam/Mister Speaker, today I would like to congratulate two distinguished achievers of the 2021 Year 12 at Coomealla High School for outstanding results in their HSC - Matthew Hancock and Makayla Witte. The disruptions of last year presented many challenges that, together, these students worked to overcome. From homeschooling to multiple exam date changes, they have shown real resilience in the face of adversity, and demonstrated that hard-work and determination really do pay off. They are role models to their school community and their success during such a disruptive period in our history makes their achievements even more commendable. I congratulate Matthew and Makayla on this wonderful accomplishment.

Term 1 student recognition assemblies

Two of our Head Teachers Ms Golledge and Ms Watson are busy organising the term 1 recognition assemblies for students to be held next Tuesday. Students will be recognised for overall academic achievement and effort, and high attendance throughout term 1. Parents are invited to attend the assemblies and final details will be posted on Compass. Students must be in school uniform to receive awards on the day. We have spare uniforms for students through our student assistance program and Year Advisers can assist any one in need of uniform.

Health alert - vaping

The NSW Government have recently launched a campaign to raise awareness about the dangers of vaping on human health. This is an issue which has arisen across the state among young people and in schools and we have had some instances of suspected vaping in our school. This is concerning as vaping is known to cause damage to lungs and interfere with brain functioning, including altering behaviour. High levels of nicotine are addictive, and the chemicals added to create flavour and smell cause harm to the lungs, brain and other vital organs. There have been instances of young people hospitalised due to lung damage associated with vaping. The NSW Department of Health have launched awebsite www.health.nsw.gov.au/vaping that contains some useful resources for schools and parents that addresses the dangers of vaping which is worth exploring and sharing with your child who may be mis-informed by advertising and not understand the risks to their health.

Vaping is illegal for people under the age of 18 and is banned at school.Students who are suspected of vaping will be provided with health information and anyone caught using or possessing vapes at school will be subject to our normal consequences around disobedience including warnings and suspensions for persistent breaches.

ANZAC day

Our students will be involved in local community ANZAC day services, with our Captains involved in making a speech and the laying of wreaths at the Wentworth ceremony. Other students are invited to join the school group in the march organised by the RSL at Wentworth and should assembly by 10.30am if they wish to join.

There will also be a local event at Dareton organised by the local action group and we will also have some student involvement in that ceremony. We will have our own school ANZAC day ceremony early in Term 2.

We are now in the final 2 weeks of term and students need to be busy finishing course and assessment work before the holidays. We wish our school community a safe and happy holiday, enjoying the lovely weather at this time of year, and please be reminded that Term 2 will commence on Wednesday 27th April for all students.
