## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

### **Electronic devices policy**

As advised by email, we have conducted trial days this week for students to get used to their phone pouches and to help us identify any issues to be resolved. Students were mostly co-operative and complied with the new routines which was pleasing. A change in routine may make some students feel stressed and worried about how they will cope, but staff are here to help and we are confident that the change will be positive for our students. We hope that this new policy will reduce phone related harassment at school, will increase social interaction of students in the playground and encourage students to be physically active and have time to relax and unwind from screen time. Students have access in some breaks to the flex room for games and small gatherings, the library for reading and board games and the outdoor oval and ball courts for active play.

Students will need to bring their debit cards to use at the canteen as they will be unable to access phones during the day.

Students who require phones for medical reasons will be able to apply for an exemption. Forms are available from the office to take to their medical practitioner for sign off and then approval from the Deputy Principals or Principal.

If you need to contact your child during the school day, you can phone the office and staff will pass the message on to your child and allow access to school phones if needed and if your child needs to access their phone for an emergency or unexpected event, they can liaise with the Deputy Principals for access as required.

As with any policies or routines at our school, if you have concerns or questions, please contact the front office and staff will direct your calls to appropriate people.

### **Holidays**

I take the opportunity to wish our staff and students a safe and happy holiday with time to relax and have fun. It has been a very busy but highly successful term for our school with more students attending over 90% of the time, more students recognised for improvement in reading and class work, rates of suspensions and negative behaviours almost halved and the introduction of our Gotcha tickets and reward excursions as incentives for positive choices.

## **TSIRBAS FAMILY SCOLARSHIP FOR DUX OF YEAR 12**

### The Tsirbas family \$5000 scholarship for DUX of year 12

The creators of this scholarship, the Tsirbas Family, are great believers in education.

Education is a gift that gives you a head start in life. A quality education is one of the truly most valuable investments that you can make with your time and others can make for you. It opens doors. A denial of education as we may have seen happens in some countries eg for children and women is a life sentence.

Christos and Chrysoula arrived in Australia after WWII and after working in many regional areas of Australia came to Dareton in 1977.

All their three children attended this high school.

Coomealla High School provides the environment for learning in its many facets, pursuing academic excellence and personal development has been a hallmark of the school.

Academic excellence is not easy, even for those who may consider themselves naturally gifted, as you progress through education it requires persistence, dedication and application. It is not always easy but the results are certainly worth it.

The three Tsirbas children went through the school in the 80s and went on to do interesting and diverse things with the education they gained here, they were children of a blockie perhaps like many of you.

Nektarios previously advised the Prime Minister from the department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet. He was the Director of the Industry, Infrastructure and Environment Division. He is now the Australian Latin America Trade Commissioner based in Santiago.

Marina is a recipient of the Menzies scholarship to Cambridge University. She is a renown expert in International law and foreign policy expert. She has served as Australia's ambassadorial staff to the Netherlands and was intimately involved with the International court of Justice in the Hague. She previously worked with the Prime Minister's office coordinating the International policy division. She was a director of the ANU foreign policy thinktank and is now the director of Government engagement for Lockheed Martin USA.

Angelo is an internationally renown Ophthalmologist and oculoplastic surgeon. He is a recipient of a Fulbright scholarship and has been a visiting professor in London, New York and Los Angeles. He still values his regional background greatly and established a surgical service to Mildura and western NSW on his return from the USA.

And many many others have gone on from this high school to lead exciting, interesting careers and lives.

Many of you will come from a rural background and will have chores to do after hours working on farms or fruit blocks, this is not a weakness as you may look to compare yourselves and the study hours that you have to those of your contemporaries in city schools. Rather it can be a strength, for the discipline that you will learn from ensuring that you complete your studies as well as holding down jobs, sporting pursuits and physical work and the life skills that you will also gain will hold you in good stead when you go to university.

People are also friendly here in Coomealla, the school and life here also helps in rounding out and teaching the students maturity and diversity.

Persistence, dedication and application, they may sound hard to grasp at the moment but as you progress through education and life you will find that they ring true.

### **Electronic devices policy**

#### Effective Term 4 2023

- 1.1 Students are not allowed to use mobile phones and associated electronic devices (air pods, smart watches, iPad) at school, including during recess and lunch.
- 1.2 The Principal and Deputy Principals will manage individual requests from parents and/or carers, and students, for any exemptions to this policy.
- 1.3 School staff with the approval of the principal, may allow students to use mobile phones in specific circumstances, such as for an educational purpose, to achieve student health and wellbeing outcomes, as part of a reasonable adjustment to enable students with specific needs to participate in education on the same basis as other students.

#### Management of electronic devices at Coomealla High School

Students will be expected to store their electronic devices locked in a magnetic pouch provided by the school during the school day. At the end of the day, students can access unlocking magnets to release their devices, prior to leaving for the day.

#### FAQs for students and parents

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How does the new policy work?	When you arrive at school, you need to put your phone on aeroplane mode, place into the pouch and lock it during the school day.  During Get Lit you need to put your locked phone on the desk to show the teacher that it is locked in the pouch.  Store the phone in the pouch for the whole day and keep in your bag or locker.		
	At the end of the day, after the bell, unlock the pouch.		
What if I have an emergency and need to make a phone call?	Report to Front Office and speak to a DP who may provide an unlocking station or allow you to use the school phone.		
What about my earphones/airpods/earbuds?	These need to be locked into the pouch and large headphones, laptops or IPADS stored in bags or lockers during the school day.		
What are the consequences if I don't follow the policy?	You will be reminded of the policy and given the chance to comply.  If you do not comply, a purple slip will be sent during lessons or the HT on Duty called in playground time.  Your phone will be confiscated for the remainder of the day and stored at the Front Office.		
	This will be documented on Compass by the teacher.  The Deputy Principal will issue a Formal Caution to suspend and phone your parents.  Repeated or unresolved incidents may result in suspension from school.		
What if I damage or lose my phone pouch?	You will need to report to the Front Office for a replacement pouch at a cost of \$10.		
What if I have a medical condition that relies on the phone for monitoring?	This should be documented in your health care plan and supported by a medical practitioner. An unlocking station is kept in the Front Office and DP office or alternatively, you may be provided with a pass by a Deputy Principal, depending on the medical condition.		
What if I need my phone to pay for food at the canteen?	You will need to bring your debit card to use instead of your phone.		
Where are the unlocking stations?	Unlocking stations will be available in these locations: - Front office - Library - Support Unit - Each block		
What if I leave early or go to TAFE?	You will be provided with access to the unlocking station when you sign out at the Front Office.
